



## **DIVaero Conflict Minerals Statement for our Customers**

DIVaero supports a 'Conflict Minerals' free supply chain. DIVaero makes reasonable efforts to avoid use in its products of raw materials that directly or indirectly finance armed groups who violate human rights.

Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform & Consumer Protection Act requires public companies in the U.S. to disclose their use of tin, tungsten, tantalum, and gold (3TGs) in their products and determine if they are sourced in an ethical manner. It was passed in 2010 to prevent armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and surrounding regions from benefiting from the sale of these minerals. The regulation has a flow-down effect to suppliers, who are responsible for upholding the indirect requirements to comply with Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act. DIVaero sources printed circuit boards and components and uses reasonable efforts to avoid the source of 'Conflict Minerals'.

DIVaero, to best of its knowledge, represents and certifies that it does not receive any materials or products containing cassiterite (tin), coltan (tantalum), wolframite (tungsten) or gold (known as "3TG minerals") sourced from the Democratic Republic of Congo or adjoining countries (known as "Covered Countries").

DIVaero will remove any supplier that is not in compliance with Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform & Consumer Protection Act.
